Happy New Year! We wish you all the very best for 2018.

This weekend we celebrate the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. This cause is one which is very close to the heart of Pope Francis. He has written and spoken about it frequently ever since his visit to the Italian island of Lampedusa, where he celebrated mass, in July 2013, for some of the many people who have arrived there by boat from the north African coast, seeking asylum and a more human way of life. Pope Francis also welcomed several families from Syria into the Vatican after his visit to that country. (You may remember that here at Worth we have received one of the “Lampedusa crosses” – a series of crosses made from the wood of one of the many small boats which were wrecked off the coast while bringing immigrants to Europe.)

In his message today Pope Francis reminds us that hospitality for the stranger is at the heart of our spiritual tradition : *You shall treat the stranger who sojourns with you as the native among you, and you shall love him as yourself, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt (Leviticus 19:34)*. Alluding also to the gospel, he continues : *Every stranger who knocks at our door is an opportunity for an encounter with Jesus Christ, who identifies with the welcomed and rejected strangers of every age (Matthew 25:35-43)*. He asks us to show them solidarity, *which must be concretely expressed at every stage of the migratory experience – from departure through journey to arrival and return.*

He states that legal means must be offered to those who need to leave their homeland. In particular he says that *collective and arbitrary expulsions of migrants and refugees are not suitable solutions, particularly where people are returned to countries which cannot guarantee respect for human dignity and fundamental rights*; and he adds, *For the sake of the fundamental dignity of every human person, we must strive to find alternative solutions to detention for those who enter a country without authorisation*. When migrants receive a sincere welcome and are given training and opportunities to work they become not a burden nor a drain on resources but a source of rich blessings to their host communities. *When duly recognised and valued, the potential and skills of migrants, asylum seekers and refugees are a true resource for the communities that welcome them. This is why I hope that, in countries of arrival, migrants may be offered freedom of movement, work opportunities, and access to means of communication, out of respect for their dignity.*

All these aspirations present challenges for our own society and government. Please do all you can to help form public opinion in a positive and Christian manner, and please pray for those who come to our country asking for our protection and help.



Let's make 2018 the year to End Hunger in the UK: Coping with the school holidays pushes many families into food poverty and insecurity. While many children from low-income families are entitled to free school meals during term time, there is currently no such provision during holidays. A recent report by the All Party Parliamentary Group on Hunger found that as many as three million children faced the risk of food insecurity this summer.

In Wales, the Assembly Government has launched a national 'Food and Fun' programme to address holiday hunger. The Westminster government needs to follow suit, and take responsibility for ensuring that children have access to good food on the 170 days a year when they are not in school.

A "Holiday Food Provision Bill" has its first reading in Parliament on 19th January. We need as many MP's to support as possible. Please ask your MP to help make sure children have good food 365 days a year. Please see the link on our website for an easy to fill form.
