### Tips for the weekend – 3<sup>rd</sup> / 4<sup>th</sup> February

A good news story!

The production of Palm Oil has been heavily implicated in deforestation of tropical rainforests and the subsequent harmful effects on animals (such as rhinos, elephants and tigers) and the displacement of indigenous people.

There has been a campaign to encourage retailers to source palm oil from sustainable sources. Sainsbury's, Tesco, Waitrose, Morrison's and the Co-Op have all signed up to this. Consumer pressure does work!

Next weekend we celebrate the World Day of the Sick, at the invitation of P Francis.

Each one of us knows people who are sick and are in need of our prayers and our care. Jesus, in his ministry, showed the sick his special attention and gave them his time and his love, showing us the way. Pope Francis reminds us that to care for the sick is an important part of the Church's vocation, and urges us to pray for those who dedicate themselves to this work, and for all whom they serve. We offer below a few lines from the Pope's message for this day.

*Jesus bestowed upon the Church his healing power: “These signs will accompany those who believe... they will lay hands on the sick, and they will recover” (Mk 16:17-18). In the Acts of the Apostles, we read accounts of the healings worked by Peter and Paul. The Church's mission is a response to Jesus' gift, for she knows that she must bring to the sick the Lord's own gaze, full of tenderness and compassion. Health care ministry will always be a necessary and fundamental task, to be carried out with renewed enthusiasm by all, from parish communities to the largest healthcare institutions. We cannot forget the tender love and perseverance of many families in caring for their chronically sick or severely disabled children, parents and relatives. The care given within families is an extraordinary witness of love for the human person; it needs to be fittingly acknowledged and supported by suitable policies. Doctors and nurses, priests, consecrated men and women, volunteers, families and all those who care for the sick, take part in this ecclesial mission. It is a shared responsibility that enriches the value of the daily service given by each.*

*Gentle and loving God, we are grateful for the call to serve you in your healing ministry. We first ask your blessing on those who are sick, especially those across the world without access to health care. Bless those who care for sick family members in their homes, comfort them all with the peace of your presence.*
