

Holy Week

With our celebration of Palm Sunday we enter into Holy Week, the summit of the Church's year. As our liturgy today reminds us, Jesus' entry into Jerusalem marks the high point of his ministry as champion of the poor: he is acclaimed as the expected Messiah by his triumphant followers on the Mount of Olives, while he is rejected by the scribes and Pharisees, on whom his prophetic action in the Temple expresses God's judgement as the leaders of the Judaism of his day. It is this action which leads directly to his condemnation by the Pharisees and Sadducees and his execution by the Roman authorities. Because it was the conviction of all the writers of the New Testament that it is Jesus' death which gains us our salvation, our remembering through the liturgy of the events of his passion, death and resurrection takes on such an importance for our lives. Through our liturgical remembering, the fruits of what Jesus accomplished for us become present to us again. This becomes especially clear in the Easter Vigil, the climax of the Triduum. After the liturgy of the fire and new light, which expresses the triumph of Jesus' resurrection over death, sin and suffering, and after the liturgy of the Word, we consecrate the baptismal font, using the Paschal Candle which has been lit from the fire, bringing the light of Christ into our community. This is the moment when around the whole world new members are baptised into the Church. This year we have no one to baptise here (though we *are* privileged to welcome two new members, already baptised Christians, into communion with the Catholic Church); but we are all invited to renew the grace of our baptism, and so to receive again the new life of the resurrection. In the early Church it was the custom, as it still is today in some Christian Churches, to have the baptismal font set into the ground, so that the new Christian would descend into the water, being completely submerged, and rise out at the other side, so expressing that, sacramentally, he or she joined Jesus in his death and resurrection. So St Paul writes: *If we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his... So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.* (Romans cp 6, vv 5 ff.)

I wish you all a happy and blessed celebration of Holy Week, and I hope that you will be able to join us for the services of the Triduum. (Please see below for a note of the times.)
