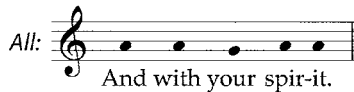
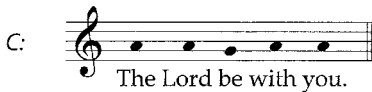
1. Forty days and forty nights
