Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers and very best wishes.

You will know that the **Synod** was officially opened in Rome by Pope Francis two weeks ago, and in our Diocese last Sunday by Bishop Richard. Our own preparation began on Saturday when we hosted a talk by Austen Ivereigh. (The book which he wrote with Pope Francis, *Let Us Dream*, is available in the bookshop in the narthex, and you might like to see an article which he wrote, which you can see on our website: https://www.worthabbeyparish.co.uk/parish-life/synodal-church/)

The speaker reminded us that this Synod (which means *journeying together*) must be the widest consultation ever undertaken in history: the questions go to the universal Church, to every diocese and every parish in every land. He told us that *participation* is the key word, that leadership is to be exercised as a team work, so rejecting a culture of clerical domination. (In an aside, he suggested that this is one response by Pope Francis to clerical abuse, which was permitted to happen because of clericalism.) He closed by saying that this Synod is the most significant event in the life of the Church since Vatican II, certainly an inspiration of the Holy Spirit, and a means to bring the theology of that Council to a deeper fruition. Do please look out for ways in which we can all be involved. I hope to be able to write about this more fully quite soon. The parish process will begin in Advent.

Meanwhile, we look forward to the opening of another event of worldwide importance this weekend — COP26, the international summit in Glasgow concerning climate change. We know that Pope Francis will not be able to attend in person, but that he has written a message for the meeting, and we know that it is an issue about which he cares very deeply, and which he expects to be at the heart of the Church's concern, most especially for the poor who suffer more than most because of climate change. He begins by stressing our interdependence — both as human beings among ourselves and between humanity the rest of God's Creation. He calls for an attitude of openness to interdependence and sharing. We cannot act alone, for each of us is fundamentally responsible to care for others and for the environment... The human person is sanctified more to the extent that he or she enters into relationships, going out from themselves to live in communion with God, with others and with all creatures... This commitment must constantly be driven by the dynamism of love...It is, he says, a call to respect: respect for creation, respect for our neighbour, respect for ourselves and for the Creator...He asks us to enter into a mutual dialogue for the sake of protecting nature, defending the poor, and building networks of respect and fraternity. Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales

Bishop Richard writes: In 2021, the UK government assumed the presidency of COP26. This provides a unique opportunity for the UK government to present its vision of a "Global Britain" and lead the way in International efforts to tackle the climate crisis.

As a Catholic community we have been given a very clear steer from Pope Francis about the importance of caring for our common home. In his 2015 encyclical Laudato Si', His Holiness made it clear that to "harm the environment was to harm human beings". Furthermore, it asks us the key questions, "What kind of world do we want to leave to those who come after us, to children who are now growing up?"

The Conference of Parties (COP26) is the 26th United Nations Climate Conference, that is set to meet in Glasgow in November 2021. It will be attended by leaders from over 200 countries to discuss climate change and how to tackle global ecological crisis. The conference follows from a series of summits including the Paris climate talks in 2015, where countries pledged to work together to keep the global temperature rise below 1.5 degrees Centigrade.

If we exceed this threshold, millions of the most vulnerable people in our communities at home and abroad will be at risk of the devastating effects of climate change. In this respect, Pope Francis also makes the link that our current environmental crisis represents a sociological crisis as well, with the effects of climate change disproportionally affecting the world's poorest communities.

In the run up to the COP26 and specifically on the last Sunday in October, we are asking people to pray that the leaders meeting in Glasgow work together for positive outcomes for people and the planet. To assist with this the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, in partnership with CAFOD have produced a prayer resource, for use in both the parish and the home, which is available in the Narthex.

Climate Justice

We want to say thank you for raising your voice this year and calling for Boris Johnson to make sure those hardest hit by the climate crisis are at the heart of the COP26 talks.

Last week, a group of faith leaders visited Downing Street to deliver a message on behalf of the thousands of CAFOD supporters who've signed our petition to the Prime Minister, as well thousands of others from faith communities across the country who've demanded action ahead of the Glasgow summit.

But given it's a message we can't afford for the PM to miss, we wanted to make doubly sure he saw it – so we've projected it onto Parliament!

The fight to tackle the climate emergency won't end in Glasgow. But the COP is vital for keeping temperature rises below the 1.5C level that will be catastrophic for our sisters and brothers in the most vulnerable communities around the world.

And it's a fight Pope Francis has called "the greatest leadership opportunity of all", so our projection called for the PM to give us faith he'll show that leadership at the COP – keeping the 1.5C goal alive, working to deliver the money rich countries have pledged to countries hardest hit and stopping support for the fossil fuels which are driving the crisis.

It's a message we want other world leaders to hear during COP26 itself, so if you're available and have not already signed up, please join us on Saturday 6 November in London to take part in a global day of action and demand leaders respond to Pope Francis's call.
