Meanwhile, moving from the world stage to our own parish, the new team who serve tea and coffee after Sunday mass begin their first "tour of duty", and I would like to take this opportunity to thank them very much for their generous service. Hospitality should be the hallmark of every Christian community, and simply giving people the opportunity to meet and talk to one another is so important. Friendship is always the best way to attract people.

Journeying Together – The Synod

We also continue to prepare to respond to the invitation of Pope Francis to help him build a different Church, one which reflects his vision. This is simply what the Vatican Council asked for all those years ago when they used the image of *The Pilgrim People of God*. This is a Church which knows that it hasn't arrived yet, which is well aware of all its faults and imperfections, and knows that we are all walking together, and that we all have our part to play to make the society which God wants. In an article which you can find on our website (https://www.commonwealmagazine.org/speak-boldly-listen-carefully) Austen Ivereigh writes : In a synodal Catholic Church authority is no longer exercised in a remote and authoritarian way. Leadership becomes "co": a matter of **collaboration**, **cooperation**, **and co-responsibility**. In a co-responsible Church the Spirit leads us all; the priest and the bishop are in the midst of the people of God, not hovering over them. It is the Church founded by Jesus Christ, but also reflecting him: no longer abusive, no longer clericalist, but synodal.

Do please make sure that you play your part in building this Church of which Pope Francis dreams. We will be forming groups in the parish to help you all to join the dream. I look forward to welcoming you all.

Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales

Bishop Richard writes: In 2021, the UK government assumed the presidency of COP26. This provides a unique opportunity for the UK government to present its vision of a "Global Britain" and lead the way in International efforts to tackle the climate crisis.

As a Catholic community we have been given a very clear steer from Pope Francis about the importance of caring for our common home. In his 2015 encyclical Laudato Si', His Holiness made it clear that to "harm the environment was to harm human beings". Furthermore, it asks us the key questions, "What kind of world do we want to leave to those who come after us, to children who are now growing up?"

The Conference of Parties (COP26) is the 26th United Nations Climate Conference, that is set to meet in Glasgow in November 2021. It will be attended by leaders from over 200 countries to discuss climate change and how to tackle global ecological crisis. The conference follows from a series of summits including the Paris climate talks in 2015, where countries pledged to work together to keep the global temperature rise below 1.5 degrees Centigrade.

If we exceed this threshold, millions of the most vulnerable people in our communities at home and abroad will be at risk of the devastating effects of climate change. In this respect, Pope Francis also makes the link that our current environmental crisis represents a sociological crisis as well, with the effects of climate change disproportionally affecting the world's poorest communities.

In the run up to the COP26 and specifically on the last Sunday in October, we are asking people to pray that the leaders meeting in Glasgow work together for positive outcomes for people and the planet. To assist with this the Bishops' Conference of England and Wales, in partnership with CAFOD have produced a prayer resource, for use in both the parish and the home, which is available in the Narthex.

We want to say thank you for raising your voice this year and calling for Boris Johnson to make sure those hardest hit by the climate crisis are at the heart of the COP26 talks.

Last week, a group of faith leaders visited Downing Street to deliver a message on behalf of the thousands of CAFOD supporters who've signed our petition to the Prime Minister, as well thousands of others from faith communities across the country who've demanded action ahead

of the Glasgow summit.

But given it's a message we can't afford for the PM to miss, we wanted to make doubly sure he saw it – so we've projected it onto Parliament!

The fight to tackle the climate emergency won't end in Glasgow. But the COP is vital for keeping temperature rises below the 1.5C level that will be catastrophic for our sisters and brothers in the most vulnerable communities around the world.

And it's a fight Pope Francis has called "the greatest leadership opportunity of all", so our projection called for the PM to give us faith he'll show that leadership at the COP – keeping the 1.5C goal alive, working to deliver the money rich countries have pledged to countries hardest hit and stopping support for the fossil fuels which are driving the crisis.

It's a message we want other world leaders to hear during COP26 itself, so if you're available and have not already signed up, please join us on Saturday 6 November in London to take part in a global day of action and demand leaders respond to Pope Francis's call.
