# Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send my prayers for any of you who are suffering because of the pandemic.

This Sunday we celebrate Peace Sunday. Pope Francis has written a message for us. He entitles it: *Dialogue Between Generations, Education and Work,* and continues to develop these three themes as keys for the promotion of peace, which he calls *the fruit of a shared commitment*. He mentions what militates against peace in our day – war, the pandemic, the effects of climate change and environmental degradation, poverty and *an economic model based on individualism rather than on solidarity and sharing… the cry of the poor and the cry of the earth constantly make themselves heard, pleading for justice and peace.* Peace is always the fruit of justice.

He stresses the need for dialogue between generations: All can work together to build a more peaceful world, starting from the hearts of individuals and relationships in the family. He says that we need to regain trust in one another. He speaks especially about our common home and the role which young people play. We ought to esteem and encourage all those young people who work for a more just world, one that is careful to safeguard the creation entrusted to our stewardship.

He then writes about the importance of education: *Teaching and education are the foundations of a cohesive civil society capable of generating hope, prosperity and progress...*But - *Military expenditures, on the other hand, have increased beyond the levels at the end of the Cold War and they seem certain to grow exorbitantly.* 

He then turns to labour: It is a path to cooperation with others, since we always work with or for someone. Seen in this clearly social perspective, the workplace enables us to learn to make our contribution towards a more habitable and beautiful world...Labour, in fact, is the foundation on which to build justice and solidarity in every community.

The material this year was created by Churches in the Middle east, who persevere with great courage in the face of so much suffering. Please pray especially for them. They write:

In this fragile and uncertain world, we look for light. We look for the good within ourselves, but often we are so overwhelmed by our weakness that hope fails us. Our confidence rests in God, who in wisdom, enables us to hope for his mercy. We are surprised when it comes in human form: Christ is the light in our midst! God's gift to us is a 'spirit of power, and love'. We are drawn forward on the way to this perfect light by God's Holy Spirit, not by relying on our own strength and ability.

In the midst of darkness, the star from the East penetrates the depths of the darkness that separates us from one another. The star's light continues to shine and to change the face of history. Throughout the ages, by the lives of Christ's followers, the world has come to know the hope that is inspired by the Holy Spirit. And the Risen One continues to shine, like a beacon guiding all into this perfect light and overcoming the darkness which separates us from one another.

The desire to overcome the darkness that separates us compels us to pray and work for Christian unity.

## Prayer

Creator of light, illumine our path by the light of Christ who moves before us and leads us. May he be a beacon for our pilgrimage. Enlighten us and dwell within us. Guide us to discover a manger in our hearts where a great light still shines.

We thank you for the gift of that unfading Star, Jesus Christ, our Lord and Saviour. Heal our divisions and draw us closer to the Light that we may find our unity in him. Amen.

We are unable to offer an ecumenical meeting at this time, but hope to do so at Pentecost this year. Meanwhile, please pray for unity. 

#### Week of Prayer for Christian Unity Week <u>18th-25th January.</u>

The story of the Magi visiting the Holy Family in Bethlehem is one very familiar to us. The Magi have sometimes been seen as a symbol of the world's diversity – different religions and cultures – that comes to pay homage to the Christ-child. The story might therefore represent the unity of all created that God desires.

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2022 has been prepared by the churches of the Middle East, the history of which was, and still is, characterised by conflict and strife, tainted with blood and darkened by injustice and oppression. The Christians of the Middle East offer these resources conscious that the world shares many of the travails and much of the difficulties that it experiences, and yearns for a light to lead the way to the Saviour who is the light that overcomes darkness.

Simply choose the amount you wish to donate and hold your card onto the reader.

You can also opt-in for Gift Aid to increase your donation by 25%. If you are a UK taxpayer then donating with Gift Aid means that we can claim an extra 25p for every £1 received.
