Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers, most especially any who are suffering from illness and any other needs.

On Tuesday, 8th we celebrate the feast of **St Josephine Bakhita**, whom we now venerate as the patron saint of victims of trafficking. She was born in about 1870 in the South Darfur region of Sudan. When she was ten years old she was captured by Arab slave traders and was subjected to very violent treatment by various owners. She subsequently had the good fortune to be sold to the Italian consul who took her to Italy to live with a family near Venice. After some years she came in contact with the Canossian Sisters there, and was baptised in 1890. Three years later she herself entered the convent and was subsequently professed as one of their community, among whom she lived for the next fifty years until her death in 1947. She was beatified by Pope St John Paul II in 1995, recognising her piety and charity.

It is now understood that there are many victims of trafficking all around the world, most especially in wealthy countries like ours. Our diocese of Arundel and Brighton has formed a commission to work on behalf of victims, and welcomes everyone's help to detect this hidden crime. They write: Every year, thousands of men, women and children fall into the hands of human traffickers, becoming unpaid modern-day slaves in their own countries and abroad. Our Diocese is committed to combatting modern slavery in all its guises and has set up a Steering Group attached to our Social Action Commission...Modern slavery manifests in many different guises including forced domestic service, human trafficking for exploitation, and crimes which enable trafficking. It is a human rights violation which has very serious consequences for the health and wellbeing of survivors; victims are often hidden away and may be unable to leave their situation, or unable to come forward because of fear or shame. They calculate that it is the most lucrative form of crime, after the trade in arms, and often preferred because it is much easier to conceal. In England, it is suggested, there are 136,000 slaves today. Many, perhaps one in four, will be children.

Could you help the Diocesan Group in their work? They write: *Our Diocesan Steering Group on Modern Slavery welcomes new members!* The task to overcome this heinous practice is enormous. Our Steering Group aims to combat modern slavery wherever it is found, diligently working toward its abolition by collaborating with other churches and

external organisations, actively raising awareness, and assisting the police in bringing the perpetrators of modern slavery to justice. Please pray for their work and for all the victims of slavery around the world.
