Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well, and I send my prayers for you all.

This weekend our parish celebrates **Racial Justice Sunday.** (This was delayed from last weekend in our diocese so that we could hold the Lourdes Pilgrimage Appeal.) The Bishops of England and Wales have produced some material for us, which includes some very beautiful images of the Virgin and Child from around the world, reflecting different cultures. They write: *The theme builds on that of the previous year's Racial Justice Sunday 'A Time to Act', which reflected on the importance of everyone recognising themselves, their race, their culture and their history in the life of the Church. Our aim, in 2022, is to continue these conversations about how we see others in the "Image and Likeness of God".* Through these images all races are invited to see themselves reflected in the persons of Mary and her child, Jesus, who took our human nature to join us with his divine nature. With **Fairtrade Fortnight** about to start, 21st Feb – 6th March, why not visit the Traidcraft stall and stock up on their products including tea, coffee, sugar and chocolate. Traidcraft ensures that farmers and workers are paid a fair wage and gives an additional premium, which is used to invest in local community projects. Monday is the start of Fairtrade fortnight.


This year Fairtrade Fortnight aims to put the spotlight on climate justice. Climate change hits those in low-income countries the hardest. Increasingly extreme, unpredictable weather is destroying bananas, coffee, cocoa and other crops. That means farmers and workers who are already underpaid have even less to spend on essentials such as education, medical treatment and even food.

Please remember when shopping that 'Fairtrade' is the gold standard of ethical trading and the world's most trusted and best-known food certification scheme. The prices paid for the crops behind some of our favourite foods need to increase significantly in order for farmers to escape the cycle of poverty and still have the means to adapt to climate emergencies. Now more than ever, they need fair pay, fair prices and fairer trading practices. 'Fairtrade' works with farmers to strengthen environmental and climate protection, to provide resources, training and knowledge so they can face climate challenges right now. 'Fairtrade' certifies products and ingredients. They independently check that their standards have been met by the farmers, workers and companies that are part of product supply chains. In order to reassure consumers that this has happened, they license the use of the 'Fairtrade' Mark on products and packaging to signal this.

As many of you know, our Traidcraft stall carries a large selection of Divine chocolate. Divine is the only chocolate company in the world which is 100% 'Fairtrade' and owned by cocoa farmers. While 'Fairtrade' ensures farmers receive a better deal for their cocoa and additional income to invest in their community, company ownership gives farmers a share of Divine's profits and a stronger voice in the cocoa industry.

Focusing on food waste

More than **35%** of global CO2 greenhouse gases come from the production and distribution of food. By preventing unnecessary food waste, we can greatly reduce the impact our eating habits are having on climate change.

In West Sussex, food waste makes up a staggering 40% of the average household general waste bin. However, up to 70% of that waste can actually be avoided!

With Food Waste Action Week taking place from 7th - 13th March, now is an excellent time to forge new habits by wasting less while also reducing food bills.

The West Sussex Waste Partnership is tackling food waste through various trials and initiatives. It is also undertaking trials of separate food waste collections to further reduce the amount of waste we send to landfill.

Invited – February Reflection

On February 11th, we had the optional Memoria of Our Lady of Lourdes. The story of Lourdes as a shrine begins in February 1858, when a local 14-year-old girl, Bernadette Soubirous, whilst collecting firewood, heard a noise like a gust of wind. She looked up towards a cave: "I saw a lady dressed in white, she wore a white dress, and equally white veils, a blue belt and a yellow rose on each foot." Bernadette made the Sign of the Cross and said the Rosary with the lady. When the prayer ended the Lady suddenly vanished. Over the following weeks, Bernadette returned to the spot and encountered the vision each time and soon the lady spoke to Bernadette. During the thirteenth vision, the Lady asked Bernadette, 'Go and tell the priests that people are to come here in procession and to build a chapel here." The local clergy were sceptical about the vision and demanded that Bernadette ask the Lady to identify herself. On 25th March, the Lady said, 'I am the Immaculate Conception.' Given the unlikelihood of Bernadette knowing this theological expression, and after further investigations, the Church authorities acknowledged the apparitions as 'worthy of belief.' Bernadette was canonised in 1933 by Pope Pius XI with her Feast Day on 16th April, the date of her death in 1879.

The site of the visions is now a worldwide pilgrimage destination, and the Diocese (in normal times) has an annual pilgrimage at the end of July. If you would like more information about this year's pilgrimage, please click here >>>
