Liturgical Ministries: assisting the parish in the liturgy

Worship is at the heart of the parish. Liturgical ministry is being involved with or assisting at Mass. All parishioners are encouraged to participate in one or more of the liturgical ministries. These include welcomers who greet everyone as they come into Mass, readers (Ministry of the Word) who proclaim scriptural (the Bible) passages during the Liturgy of the Word or those who lead the Universal Prayers (Intercessions), altar servers who assist the presider at the altar, cantors and music ministers who lead the singing, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion who distribute Communion, either within Mass or by taking it to the wider parish community, who are housebound due to health, age or disability.

Welcoming: While the Ministry of Welcome extends to all members of the parish community, welcomers are very often the first person that a stranger will meet or speak to when entering the Abbey Church for the first time. It is especially important that newcomers receive a warm welcome and whatever guidance and help they may need when they come to Mass. As part of the parish welcome ministry team you will be asked to arrive about 20 minutes before the start of Mass to greet people as they arrive, hand out the Vigil Mass or Sunday Mass sheet and other items as required. You may also be asked to usher any latecomers to the remaining seats in the church and deal with any matters that may arise within the congregation during the Mass.

Readers: The Ministry of the Word is a good choice for those who can confidently speak in front of the congregation. To be an effective reader calls for adequate preparation which includes study, prayer and practice. A good reader will speak loudly, clearly and with meaning so that everyone attending the Mass can hear. The readings precede the Gospel and are read from the ambo in the centre of the sanctuary. In the absence of a psalm cantor, the reader may also proclaim the Responsorial Psalm after the First Reading.

Altar Servers: The Ministry of Server is open to all members of the congregation from the age of eight. Altar servers help the priest during Mass, working together as a team to ensure that all parts of the Mass are well supported. They carry the cross and processional candles. They hold the book for the priest when he is not at the altar. They carry the incense and thurible and present the bread and wine along with the water to the priest during the preparation of the gifts or assist him when he receives the gifts from the people. They assist in the washing of hands by the priest.
