Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

On Thursday this week we have the very happy celebration of the Confirmation of a group of young people from our parish, which takes place in the Friary in Crawley: Bruno and Oliver Strama, Amelia Bullen, Ben McAlister, and Dylan Killick Roberts. Please pray for them, that the Holy Spirit will guide them in their lives and that they find their true vocations as disciples and members of the Church. Please pray also for their families and mentors, that they will be able to continue to guide them as they grow in their faith. Please pray too for their catechists, Lizzy Wakeling and Penny Stokoe, who have led their sessions over the past seven months with great dedication, generosity and skill. We owe them a huge debt of gratitude, and I would like to record here my sincere thanks to them.

Meanwhile, when you arrive at church this weekend, you will see that the scaffolding is at last in place so that the necessary work on the roof can be completed. We expect it to be in place until towards the end of the year. Please be assured that the normal masses at the weekend, both Saturday and Sunday, and weekday masses and all the monastic offices, will be celebrated and open to everyone. If there should be any change we will let you know.

However, access to the East door is now restricted. Please do not drive down to the East door. There is no parking there, nor any room to turn. Please could everyone enter by the narthex. Anyone who has a problem with stairs is welcome to use the **lift**, which will take you down to the West door. Turn right as you enter the narthex, walk to the end and pass through the door next to the Gents' toilets. Walk down the corridor, through several (automatic) doors, until you come to the large window on your left which overlooks the interior of the church. The lift is then on your right.

Prayer in Action

Parishioner Gillian Maher offers us this account of an excellent local company which can help communities save money on power, and also help to save the planet.

It has been our tradition for many years to support charities providing services to disabled and

disadvantaged people and, sadly, more recently, by supporting food banks in our local communities.

However, new opportunities are now arising which provide an opportunity to respond to Pope Francis' call to us all, to protect Creation and all Life on Planet Earth, our Common Home. Small, not-for-profit companies are using renewable energy to reduce the carbon emissions of our local communities by providing solar panels and LED lighting to schools, charities and village halls - free of charge.

This can save thousands of £s annually to our most important local amenities, while providing an excellent financial return to local investors and savers.

Here in our parish Repower Balcombe is providing an opportunity to invest in share offers which provide solar panels to our local schools and community buildings and charities. All costs are borne by the company, and the energy generated by the sun and bright daylight replaces the energy provided by oil, gas and coal. It can save even the smallest Primary School thousands of £s over the school year.

The capital which pays for these projects is raised through share offers to which we can all subscribe - and receive a dividend, which in recent years has far exceeded the rates available from our building societies and banks; but this is not the only benefit available.

The income received from the National Grid for the energy generated by the company is used to cover the costs of running the company, meeting regulatory demands and providing the panels at no cost to other recipients. The surplus income is then paid into a Community Fund, which provides free LED lighting to other community resources, refrigerators and freezers to local food banks and a growing list of options to assist the wider community. There are no staff wages, salaries or bonuses to be paid, as all the time and expertise required is donated, or hired for each project as required from an agency, which is also a community interest company. A truly virtuous circle!

This is a wonderful opportunity for us all to save money, while also sharing the benefit of this opportunity with the wider community. Some people like to donate the dividend they receive to other charities and good causes, thereby magnifying the blessings received.

The event will be on Zoom followed by questions, answers and discussion.

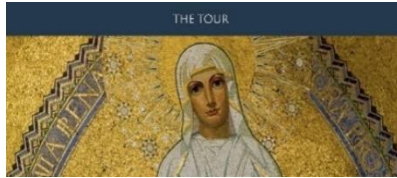
