

Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are all well. I send you all my prayers.

This weekend we begin our parish appeal, **Our Call to Stewardship**. This week we will think about sharing our time, one of God's most precious gifts. At each mass, after a brief homily, a member of the congregation will be invited to speak about the topic of the week, Time, Treasure or Talent. As you come into the narthex you will see a display of the many areas of parish life in which you can become involved, and on the tables, you will find sheets inviting you to show your interest in a particular activity. Do please take a moment to look at these opportunities for your involvement, and consider what are your own particular gifts, and how you might use them to bring blessings to your community. Our appeal comes from the conviction that God has given gifts to each one of us, and that His gifts are given for the service of one another and to build up our community. This implies that each of us is called to play a part in fostering our parish and our wider community of Church and society in general. The more generous we are, the more deeply we are involved, then the more integrated we will be and the stronger will be our community. We all have a part to play in building up the Body of Christ, and bringing the face of Christ to the world.

As a parish we are committed to the vision of Divine Renovation. At its heart is the meeting at a personal level with Jesus. For this we try to offer opportunities through the Alpha courses which we run. (Team members, who cook and serve food, wash up and lead discussion are always needed – there's plenty of variety of service here! And I take this opportunity to thank all those who fulfil this service for us.) Leading on from this are the many kinds of catechesis and work to support this; hospitality, whether leading or hosting a house group or prayer group, or welcoming members to our Sunday masses; and service within the liturgy. Do please ensure that you look at the display in the narthex and all the opportunities listed there, and, if you have not received a copy of *Get Involved* then do please pick up a copy in the Narthex and search through it to find some ministry in which you would like to take part. The ideal of Divine Renovation is that every parishioner, according to his or her possibilities, will be involved in some ministry. Finally, and most important, all this needs the support of prayer, that everything which we plan and do may be inspired and carried through by the Holy Spirit. Please do support us in this way – a ministry which each of us can undertake, whatever our circumstances.

Thank you all for your generous support of our parish.
