Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are all well. I send my prayers for you all.

This weekend we continue our parish appeal, **A Call to Stewardship**, and this time the theme is Sharing Your Treasure. George Fitzsimons will speak to us at mass about our parish finances and how we can help. You will find included in this copy of In Touch an analysis to guide you through the figures, and copies will also be available before mass. I take this opportunity to thank George for his help with this, and all our parish finance team, especially our chair, Giles Horner; and I would like to thank you all for your generosity which helps to keep the parish running.

Meanwhile we are approaching the end of **Creation Time**, with the feast of St Francis on October 4th. We celebrate this here at Worth with a special mass on Saturday, beginning with a blessing of pets on the piazza at 4.45. Young people are especially welcome. It is a theme which has very serious implications for the next generation.

As always, Pope Francis has written us a message, asking us to practise an "ecological conversion". "Listen to the voice of creation" is the theme and invitation of this year's Season of Creation. It is a special time for all Christians to pray and work together to care for our common home... This Season is an opportunity to cultivate our "ecological conversion", a conversion encouraged by Saint John Paul II as a response to the "ecological catastrophe" predicted by Saint Paul VI back in 1970. He continues: If we learn how to listen, we can hear in the voice of creation a kind of dissonance. On the one hand, we can hear a sweet song in praise of our beloved Creator; on the other, an anguished plea, lamenting our mistreatment of this our common home... Listening to these anguished cries, we must repent and modify our lifestyles and destructive systems. From its very first pages, the Gospel calls us to "repent, because the kingdom of heaven has come near" (Mt 3:2); it summons us to a new relationship with God, and also entails a different relationship with others and with creation. The present state of decay of our common home merits the same attention as other global challenges such as grave health crises and wars. "Living our vocation to be protectors of God's handiwork is essential to a life of virtue; it is not an optional or a secondary aspect of our Christian experience" (Laudato si', 217). He goes on to reflect our hopes for COP27, to continue the work of the previous conference: *The COP27* conference on climate change, to be held in Egypt in November 2022 represents the next opportunity for all to join in promoting the effective implementation of the Paris Agreement. Again, he stresses the need for conversion: Limiting temperature increase to 1.5°C is

demanding... This means "converting" models of consumption and production, as well as lifestyles, in a way more respectful of creation and the integral human development of all peoples, present and future, a development grounded in responsibility and concern for the poor and for future generations. Underlying all this, there is need for a covenant between human beings and the environment, which, for us believers, is a mirror reflecting "the creative love of God, from whom we come and towards whom we are journeying". The transition brought about by this conversion cannot neglect the demands of justice, especially for those workers who are most affected by the impact of climate change.

Our Parish, Our Responsibility

"Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms".

Last week we explored Stewardship. As we continue on our stewardship journey, this week we will look at our parish's finances.

Our parish must:

- Cover normal running costs
- Pay staff
- Provide financial support to the Diocese

Our parish also supports parish programmes and activities such as sacramental preparation, adult formation and monthly brunch after Mass and, if funds permit, tries to make donations to good causes in the local community and elsewhere.

This parish family receives no money from the Vatican, Diocese, Abbey or Government. Our parish family and life rely exclusively on your donations.

Here are the forecast Parish results for 2022 (numbers rounded to nearest £1,000):

The parish also has general reserves of some £60,000 (which would cover 6 months' costs), for use in emergencies.

Costs are increasing (including contribution to the diocese, utilities and other costs) and the 2022 forecast is for a **deficit of £5,000**. Previous years' results have gone up and down but on average have tended to be roughly break-even.


Weekly Mass attendance at Worth has halved over the past 10 years, to 246 people in 2021. **Income has decreased by 10%** compared to pre-Covid levels.

There are just 126 regular givers by Standing Order and the top 10 of those represent 22% of the total.

Standing Order is one of the best ways to support our parish.

A standing order is an instruction to your bank to make regular fixed payments to the parish. This provides a more secure and more efficient income that can be easily Gift Aided.

To avoid getting cash each week for Mass, you can set up your Standing Order with us after Mass.

It's easy to do and there's no extra cost to you. If you are a UK tax payer, please consider signing up to Gift Aid – the parish can claim an extra 25p for every £1 you donate.
