Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families remain well. I send you all my prayers.

Last Sunday after mass a group of us watched the film, *The Letter*, the film which was made by the Laudato Si Movement together with the Vatican, concerning climate change and the crisis which faces us. It is one of the most moving and powerful films I have ever seen. I recommend it very highly to you all. (It can be seen on YouTube:

https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Rps9bs85BII) It shows the great beauty of the natural world – the Brazilian Amazon, the polar regions, coral reefs – and shows how they are being destroyed by human activity. Above all, it shows how all this impacts on the lives of five individuals from different continents, and how they are united by the initiative of P Francis who invites them to meet him. In this way their lives and their emotions are brought very close to us. I particularly remember scenes of the man from Senegal, learning while in Rome of the deaths of his friends while trying to reach Europe by boat, driven from their home by rising sea levels which are destroying their town, and by the drought which destroys their livelihood of farming. But, together with immense sadness, we are shown scenes of hope and joy: the guests of P Francis bond in great strength of solidarity as climate activists, and we are left with the sense of the deep compassion and understanding of the one who leads our Church, and we feel that God's strength and love are truly at work here. The image which comes to me is that from the beginning of the book of Genesis – the Holy Spirit who hovers over the waters of chaos with outspread wings, bringing the maternal love and warmth of God's care for His Creation. Those of you who attended the talk and book launch of Abbot Christopher will surely recognise here the language of grace – the power of love overcoming human greed and indifference.

Meanwhile, COP27 continues in Egypt. On the opening day the Prime Minister of Barbados stated that the prosperity – and high carbon emissions – of the rich world had been achieved at the expense of the poor in times past, and now the poor were being forced to pay again, as victims of climate breakdown that they did not cause. She warned of a billion climate refugees around the world by the middle of the century if governments failed to tackle the climate crisis.

A central theme of the conference has become the demand for climate justice - the fact that poor people are bearing the brunt of the damage to the climate, in the form of extreme weather, while rich countries have failed to live up to their promises to cut emissions and to provide finance to help the poor with climate breakdown.


