First Sunday of Advent (year A) 26th / 27th November 2022 No: 1318

Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families continue well. I send you all my prayers.

This weekend we begin our celebration of Advent, the beginning of the Church's year. It's a moment which we can easily miss, for it is a time when we start to prepare for Christmas. Shops especially will encourage us to do this, by putting up decorations and playing Christmas carols while we walk around the aisles of the supermarkets, inviting us to buy Christmas cakes and Christmas puddings, copiously decorated with holly and berries, and a whole range of gifts to fill our Christmas stockings. So, it's very easy to miss Advent altogether in our anxiety to be ready for Christmas. And this is a shame, for Advent has a character all of its own which offers us great spiritual riches. The word Advent means Coming – the coming of Jesus. The focus of the first two weeks invites us to reflect on the Return of Jesus at the end of time: Jesus will come in glory and majesty as King, to establish fully the Kingdom of God, with God's gifts of justice and peace for all. (The purple of the Advent vestments is the purple of royalty.) So, it is a time of joyful expectation, especially the third Sunday, traditionally know as Gaudete Sunday, the Sunday of *Rejoicing*. But it also has a sombre character, as we are warned to prepare for the Judgement which the Coming of Jesus will bring us, a moment for introspection and repentance. The early Church Fathers spoke of three comings of Jesus: his first coming, when he was born in the stable, a coming in weakness and humility and suffering, accepting all the limitations of our human existence; and his second coming at the end of time, a coming in all the power and glory of the majesty of God the Father. But they also spoke of a third coming, the countless moments in our lives when he comes as it were hidden and in disguise, in all sorts of unexpected people and circumstances. St Bernard expresses it thus: ... The third coming lies between the other two. It is invisible, while the other two are visible. Because this coming lies between the other two, it is like a road on which we travel from the first coming to the last. In the first, Christ was our redemption; in the last, he will appear as our life; in this middle coming, he is our rest and consolation.

Do try to make time, during the activity and rush of your Christmas preparations, to experience his *rest and consolation* of which St Bernard speaks. A suggestion might be to spend a few minutes each day in prayerful meditation on the gospel of the day, or use some of the prayer suggestions given on line below. I pray that we may all experience again the power of God's love as we open our hearts to His coming. We might also prepare ourselves to meet Jesus by looking for opportunities to serve those in most need who live around us – the lonely, the sick, the stranger and the homeless person, the detainee...We see the face of Our Lord in each of them. I wish you a happy and holy season of Advent, and I send you all my best wishes. Yours. Fr Paul

Wild Fallow Deer Venison for Sale

There is now wild Fallow Deer venison available to buy.

A whole skinned Fallow Deer carcase (approx. 25 kg) is £4/kg and our farm manager has organised a fee of £50 per carcase for James A Harris & son - Butchers in Smallfield - to process.

This should result in 12 to 15kg of venison cuts.

So, the cost will be around £150 for 12-15kg of venison - or approx. £10 to £12 per kg - which is significantly less than the retail price of venison.

On Sunday, **December 4**th the parish offers a discussion group to look at the National Synthesis which the Bishops are submitting. You will remember that *Synod* means *walking together*. It is an invitation to Catholics all over the world to play our part in building the Church under the guidance and with the strength of the Holy Spirit. In doing so we become *The Pilgrim People of God*, each of us offering the gifts which God has given us to create a strong and vibrant community. In our meeting on Sunday, we will look at topics which particularly affect our own parish, and think about how we can improve the service we offer, and how we can improve our mission to society. We will begin by thinking about the process so far, and we then propose looking at paragraphs 21 - 45 of the national document,

COP27

CAFOD write: For decades, the countries hardest hit by the climate crisis have been calling on those most responsible for causing it to provide money to deal with the loss of livelihoods, homes and ways of living. Rich countries have finally said they'll do so. As the COP27 talks drew to a close in the early hours of Sunday morning, negotiators in Egypt agreed to set up a 'loss and damage fund' to assist communities suffering irreversible devastation in the face of the climate emergency.

This is a huge victory – and it shows the power communities have worldwide when we raise our voices and demand action.

But there's still so much to do. Governments might have committed to set up a loss and damage fund, but too few of them have yet committed to put money into the fund.

And worse still, too many countries at COP27 blocked further commitments to stop supporting the fossil fuels at the root of the climate crisis, condemning people in communities most vulnerable to its effects to further loss and damage.

We need to keep raising our voices. As Fr Leonard Chiti, Jesuit Provincial for Southern Africa, says, the effects of the climate crisis are taking hold worldwide, "causing deep and painful suffering for millions of people".

We're resolved to keep demanding action to prevent this injustice. We hope you'll join us.
