Third Sunday of Lent (year A) 11th / 12th March 2023 No: 1331

Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

As we continue our celebration of Lent our RCIA group enter the time of Scrutinies. These fall on the next three Sundays during mass. It takes the form of a moment of prayer for the candidates who are asking for baptism and initiation (Pamela Bagwell) and for reception into the Catholic Church (Edward Dean and Mark Bearman). It comes after the homily, and begins with an opportunity for each of us to take a moment of silent prayer for them, followed by two formal prayers. commentary on the rite tells us: The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. For the scrutinies are celebrated in order to deliver the elect from the power of sin, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. These rites, therefore, should complete the conversion of the elect and deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to carry out their decision to love God above all... The elect must have the intention of achieving an intimate knowledge of Christ and his Church, and they are expected particularly to progress in genuine self-knowledge through serious examination of their lives and true repentance. Reading these words, it is clear that they apply equally to each one of us. Their time of preparation and purification is also ours. This is the meaning of Lent, which began as the accompaniment of candidates by the whole Church as we travel together towards Easter - achieving an intimate knowledge of Christ and his Church. Do please pray for them and make them welcome in our community; and please remember that each one of us is responsible through the example of our way of life for their formation, as equally for one another's spiritual wellbeing. Please consider if you, or someone whom you know, might benefit from the RCIA course. We expect to start a new course after Easter. Do please get in touch.

Meanwhile, as I write today we celebrate **International Women's Day**. *Life* organisation have written a message for this day explaining their own perspective: *This International Women's Day*, we think of equity in terms of parenthood and adoption. We want to make sure that, for every pregnancy, parenthood or adoption are at least as viable an option as an abortion is. When we create that equitable world – which requires journeying with women, in radical solidarity – we'll find that the demand for abortion reduces, and more women will freely choose motherhood or adoption. And that's a world worth striving for. Do please see the report on their excellent work on our website, and consider how you might be able to support them, either personally in one of their houses, or financially.
