## **Dear Parishioners**

I hope that you and your families are all well. I send you all my prayers.

This weekend we begin our celebration of Holy Week with Palm Sunday, when we commemorate the entry of Jesus into Jerusalem acclaimed by his disciples as Messiah. This moment begins his most intense denunciation of the leadership of the Jewish state, the Sadducees and Pharisees, for their oppression of the poor, from whom were drawn his disciples. As we reflect on the prophetic ministry of Jesus we might remember Bishop St Oscar Romero of El Salvador, whose feast day is marked on March 24th, the day of his assassination. Oscar Romero was chosen as Archbishop in 1977, at a time of great social upheaval in El Salvador, a tiny state in Central America, with a rich Catholic heritage. The country was ruled, and owned, by twelve families, while the rest of the population lived in misery, oppressed by the ruling families. The poor began to protest their way of life and the injustice which they suffered, and they were supported increasingly by their priests. Romero was elected at this moment because he was expected to put an end to this – an academic, and a "safe pair of hands". But, as he witnessed the suffering of his people, he was gradually converted to become the prophet and champion of the poor, and for this reason he was assassinated on the orders of the military on 24th March, 1980, while celebrating mass. This was a tragic and also a highly symbolic moment: having shared in Jesus' prophetic ministry during his life, he then shared in his death. This cup is the new covenant in my blood which will be poured out for you.

Romero was recognised immediately by his people as a martyr and a saint, and was beatified by Pope Francis in May, 2015. His life and death show us clearly what it means to be a prophet – *To do justice for the poor and oppressed, this is truly to know God*, he said. He became "the voice of the voiceless", and a model and inspiration for the prophetic vocation of the Church. He declared, *A Church that does not join the poor in order to speak out on behalf of the poor and against the injustices committed against them is not the true Church of Jesus Christ.* 

Please pray that we may be inspired to follow his example in whatever way we can under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Meanwhile, I wish you a celebration of Holy Week which will lead us all closer to The Kingdom of God.
