Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

I hope that you are enjoying the blessings of Easter, with the joy and the hope which our feast inspires. I should like to share with you some lines from the address by Pope Francis at Easter, in which he prays for the Church and all nations around the world.

Dear brothers and sisters, Christ is risen! May this Easter be for each of you, dear brothers and sisters, and in particular for the sick and the poor, the elderly and those experiencing moments of trial and weariness, a passage from affliction to consolation. We are not alone: Jesus, the Living One, is with us, forever. Let the Church and the world rejoice, for today our hopes no longer come up against the wall of death, for the Lord has built us a bridge to life. Yes, brothers and sisters, at Easter the destiny of the world was changed, and on this day, we can rejoice to celebrate, by pure grace, the most important and beautiful day of history... Humanity now sees the goal of its journey, sees the meaning of its destiny, Jesus Christ, and is called to make haste to meet him, who is the hope of the world.

May we too make haste to progress on a journey of reciprocal trust: trust among individuals, peoples and nations. May we allow ourselves to experience amazement at the joyful proclamation of Easter, at the light that illumines the darkness and the gloom in which, all too often, our world finds itself enveloped.

Pope Francis appeals to us to exercise the trust which Jesus' Resurrection inspires, and to overcome conflict: Let us make haste to surmount our conflicts and divisions, and to open our hearts to those in greatest need. Let us hasten to pursue paths of peace and fraternity. Let us rejoice at the concrete signs of hope that reach us from so many countries, beginning with those that offer assistance and welcome to all fleeing from war and poverty. He turns to prayer for those in greatest need: Comfort refugees, deportees, political prisoners and migrants, especially those who are most vulnerable, as well as the victims of hunger, poverty and the dire effects of the drug trade, human trafficking and all other forms of slavery. Lord, inspire the leaders of nations to ensure that no man or woman may encounter discrimination and be violated in his or her dignity; that in full respect for human rights and democracy

these social wounds may be healed; that the common good of the citizenry may be pursued always and solely; and that security and the conditions needed for dialogue and peaceful coexistence may be guaranteed. He appeals to us to allow God to renew our lives: Brothers, sisters, may we rediscover the enjoyment of the journey, quicken the heartbeat of hope and experience a foretaste of the beauty of heaven! Peace be with you!

Meanwhile, this weekend we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday, when we pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Parish Finance Update

We would like to thank parishioners very much indeed for their generosity in responding to last Autumn's appeal for an increase in donations. About a quarter of our regular donors increased their giving, in some cases significantly.

The final 2022 result (income less expenditure) was more or less break-even (a surplus of £353). We have received two generous legacies in 2023, totalling £7,000, which should mean that this year is less of a concern, but without the legacies our income would still be expected to be below costs, which is of course a matter to consider for 2024.

The Parish finances, which are part of Arundel & Brighton Diocese, are completely independent from Worth Abbey (though the Parish pays sums to the Abbey for the services of our Parish Priest and for use of the Abbey Church and other facilities).

Thursday 18th **May – Ascension Thursday.** Mass will be celebrated with the school at 4.30pm. There will be no mass at 5.30pm.



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Adult Formation Course

Level 1 - part A. 6th -7th May, 5th - 6th August and 2nd - 3rd September at Worth Abbey.

The CGS Level 1 formation course prepares adults to offer the catechesis to children age 3-6 and is also the foundation course to build on for those called to serve children age 6-9 in Level 2 and children age 9-12 in Level 3.

The complete Level 1 formation course requires a minimum of 90 hours which includes lectures, presentations on how to demonstrate the use of the materials to children, material making and practicum. The three weekends this May, August and September will cover part A, the first half of the formation (i.e. 45 hours)

A further 3 weekends will be needed to complete the course and receive certification. We are able to accept 20 participants onto this course.

The cost of the course is dependent on the number of participants. (tbc)

Applications from pilgrims requiring assistance to journey with the Diocese Pilgrimage to Lourdes this summer are back to pre-Covid numbers – which is wonderful news, but it does mean we now need lots of helpers, nurses and HCA's to apply to make sure we have enough people to care for them in Lourdes. "Being a helper is an act of service that many of us do not get to offer during our day to day lives. Giving our time and care for a week in Lourdes can make such a positive impact on the life and wellbeing of the people we help, and ourselves. There are many ways that you can help someone, the first step is to apply!".

The cost for Helpers and Clinicians is £680 (subsidised) or £850 full price. There are further subsidies which may be available.

CAFOD - Fix our broken food system

CAFOD's <u>campaign to fix our broken food system</u> is deeply rooted in our Catholic faith and its teachings. The proverb "One sows and another reaps" (John 4:37) touches on our basic sense of what is and isn't fair. When one person does all the work and another benefits, injustice reigns. By contrast, everyone enjoying the work of their own hands epitomises justice and balance: "They will build houses and dwell in them; they will plant vineyards and eat their fruit. No longer will they build houses for others to inhabit, nor plant for others to eat" (Isaiah 65:21).

Half of the world's seeds are now owned by large private businesses [with an ongoing] struggle over who owns this precious resource, which provides the source for the food we eat. Jony (pictured), is the director of UBINIG, Policy Research for Development Alternative one of CAFOD's partners in Bangladesh, he explains the control that seed companies have: "If a company wants to introduce a [seed] variety, even if it has been bred from varieties that used to be native to Bangladesh, they introduce it by their own name and under their own patent. So, the farmers don't have any claim."

Seed companies reap profits, but small-scale farmers are locked into a [cycle of] dependence. Without control over the seeds, or the ability to save and share them, if a flood strikes and wipes out the harvest, there is no fall-back.
