Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are all well. I send you all my prayers.

This weekend we are asked to observe the World Day of Social Communications. There will be a second collection for the Bishops' work in this field.

In a culture which is increasingly marked by violent discourse in public life we are in great need of Christian orientation to guide our speech and writing; and the growing disregard for truth, manifest in the concept of "fake news", and the idea of "my truth" as opposed to "your truth", undermines the very possibility of communication at all. Pope Francis offers us a reflection for this day which opens with an assertion that we must always begin our discourse not by speaking, but by listening. (The word *listen* is the first word of the Rule of St Benedict, and also plays a very significant part in his vision of monastic life.) He opens: After having reflected in past years on the verbs "to go and see" and "to listen" as conditions for good communication, I would like to focus on "speaking with the heart". It is the heart that spurred us to go, to see and to listen, and it is the heart that moves us towards an open and welcoming way of communicating. Once we have practised listening, which demands waiting and patience, as well as foregoing the assertion of our point of view in a prejudicial way, we can enter into the dynamic of dialogue and sharing, which is precisely that of communicating in a cordial way. After listening to the other with a pure heart, we will also be able to speak following the truth in love (cf. Eph 4:15). We should not be afraid of proclaiming the truth, even if it is at times uncomfortable, but of doing so without charity, without heart. Because "the Christian's programme" — as Benedict XVI wrote — "is 'a heart which sees'". A heart that reveals the truth of our being with its beat and that, for this reason, should be listened to. This leads those who listen to attune themselves to the same wave length, to the point of being able to hear within their heart also the heartbeat of the other. Then the miracle of encounter can take place, which makes us look at one another with compassion, welcoming our mutual frailties with respect rather than judging by hearsay and sowing discord and division. He continues by reminding us that we need a pure heart: The call to speak with the heart radically challenges the times in which we are living, which are so inclined towards indifference and indignation, at times even on the basis of disinformation which falsifies and exploits the truth.

I commend to you this document of Pope Francis which contains much wisdom for our times. LVII World Communications Day, 2023 - Speaking with the heart. "The truth in love" (Eph 4:15)

Holy Communion under the species of bread alone.

After consultation, we have decided that at Worth Abbey we shall for the time being continue to offer Holy Communion under the species of bread alone.

See, Catechism of the Catholic Church (1377) 'Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts'.

And (CCC 1390) 'Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace.

For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite'.

We shall continue to monitor the advice offered by Public Health England, and the guidance offered by our Bishops, as well as local practice in the Diocese.

The reception of Holy Communion on the tongue

During the pandemic, the practice of receiving holy communion on the tongue was discontinued. As we return to normal, we shall now adopt the practice of restoring this option at communion during mass. In common with many parishes across the diocese we ask that those who wish to receive holy communion on the tongue come forward at the end of the communion procession.

This weekend there is a Second Collection for "World Communications Sunday" – The theme this year, chosen by Pope Francis is Speaking with the Heart

Please be reassured that, although Rachel Davies has retired from First Holy Communion and Safeguarding, she continues her generous service with Junior Church. Apologies for any confusion!
