Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

This week sees various events which remind us of our Christian duty to protect our environment. This is at the heart of both Christian and Jewish spirituality. At the very beginning of the book of Genesis we read that, as God reflected on His work of Creation, He "saw that it was very good". The beauty and goodness of our material world reflect the beauty and goodness of the Creator. Creation is a sacrament of God, through which we can come to know God Himself. At the end of the first chapter, we read that God made man and woman in His own image and likeness, giving us the command to rule His Creation. This command does not give us licence simply to exploit the world, but we rule as His "vice-regents", His representatives, to fulfil His purposes for Creation as its King and Creator. We are stewards in His place, to care for His Creation. This is expressed again in the following chapter, when God places man and woman in the Garden "to cultivate and care for it". In his encyclical, Laudato Si, On Care for Our Common Home, Pope Francis writes: The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God. (#84)

Next week we begin **The Great Big Green Week**. The organisers write: The Great Big Green Week is the UK's biggest ever celebration of community action to tackle climate change and protect nature. Every year, people come together to unleash a wave of support for action to protect the planet. Tens of thousands of people in every corner of the country celebrate the heartfelt, brave, everyday actions being taken to stand up for nature and fight climate change. Meanwhile on Monday of this week we observed **World Environment Day**. Pope Francis, commenting on this, writes: We are all part of this gift of creation. We are a part of nature, not separated from it. This is what the Bible tells us. The current environmental situation calls us to act now with urgency to become ever more responsible stewards of creation and to restore the nature that we have been damaging and exploiting for too long. Otherwise, we risk destroying the very basis on which we depend. We risk floods, and hunger and severe consequences for ourselves and for future generations. This is what many scientists tell us. We need to take care of each other, and of the weakest among us. Continuing down this path of exploitation and destruction – of humans, and of nature - is unjust and unwise. This is what a responsible conscience would tell us.

Catechesis Group 2023-2024 (RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

In September we are starting a new **RCIA group** for those planning to be received into the Catholic Church. The aim of the group is to give an overview of Church teaching, some in-depth exploration of doctrine, and formation in the basic aspects of Christian living. The group will be led by Geoff Chapman, and will follow a course called *Sycamore*, a very helpful series of high-quality videos that give a good balance between input and group discussion. Each session is 60 to 90 minutes long, and the course will run weekly, during school term time, from September through to Easter. The group is informal and discussion based and is a great way to get to know people in the Parish better.

In previous years, we have also found that the course is very suitable for anyone who is exploring the Catholic faith, even if they are not sure about becoming Catholic, as well as Catholics who wish to grow in their understanding. This extra participation is also very helpful for those who are in RCIA, so we would encourage to come along to support them if you have the time.

Gatwick Detainees Welfare Group

GDWG is a small Crawley charity, helps people detained in two immigration removal centres at Gatwick Airport. Volunteers visit detained people, and the charity provides emotional and practical support. Refugee Tales is an outreach project of the charity that raises awareness of detention through walks and four published books. Since 2015, Refugee Tales walkers have walked in solidarity with refugees and detained people. They have been met with kindness and hospitality every step of the way.

Taking Chaucer's great poem of journeying as a model - established writers and people with lived experience of detention share their tales with local communities at evening events at the end of each day of walking. They enjoy live performances from renowned musicians. From Saturday 8th - Wednesday 12th July, Refugee Tales walker's journey from Three Bridges to Worthing.

There will be a FREE public evening event in Haywards Heath at 7pm on Saturday 8th July at the Hub Theatre, Haywards Heath College, Harlands Rd Haywards Heath RH16 1LT where writer Haifa Zangara will read a tale alongside a tale by a person who is an expert by experience and music by local Kora player Jali Mbye plus folk musician Greg Russell.

All money raised by the walk goes towards the charity, GDWG, so that support can continue for people in Gatwick Immigration Removal Centres and post-detention. This support includes weekly visits from Volunteer Visitors, phone credit to ensure detained people can contact their friends and family, clothes, referrals to lawyers and other organisations, and supermarket vouchers for people released into destitution. The funds also support the charity to continue inviting previously detained people on Refugee Tales walks and to keep working towards a future without detention.

Mental Health First Aid Courses

The sad reality is that mental health across the nation is a growing concern and reality.

Only last week we saw in the national press the truly horrible indictment that suicide is the leading cause of teenage deaths in the UK.

The idea of the Mental Health first aid course is to give delegates the skills to identify the early warning signs of a problem developing, from across the wide spectrum of mental health conditions and then to provide the direction to sign post people accordingly to the right help and support.

The half day and full day course are aimed at identifying systems and exploring appropriate routes to signpost those who are experiencing the challenge and darkness of mental health.
