

# Dear Parishioners,

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

I write this week to tell you about our new Family Catechism programme which we will launch in September.

All the research into the transmission of faith shows that constant accompaniment, parental support and a sense of belonging to the Parish community leads to young people growing and staying in a relationship with the Lord. To that end, we have devised a series of groups that will offer sessions for families to attend, and these will replace Sacramental Preparation courses as we currently know them. This is in line with recommendations from the Diocesan Youth Adviser. (Please see the Diocesan Pastoral Plan, *The Word Who Is Life*, *#7*, *A Renewed Vision of Catechesis - <u>The word who is life</u>)* 

I would like to say a huge thank you to the working group who have been involved in pulling all of this together, as well as the volunteers who have stepped forward to be a part of this exciting new project, all under the direction of Lizzie Wakeling, the Diocesan Youth Adviser, to whom we owe our very grateful thanks. I ask everyone to pray for the success of this venture as we move forward.

The pathway includes our wonderful Parish brunches (to which everyone is invited), thanks to Abby Chapman and her excellent team, as well as three new groups:

All Saints-A group for 6-9-year olds and their families which will replace the First Holy Communion Programme as we know it. This will enable children to receive the Sacrament of the Eucharist when they are spiritually ready, rather than when they are in a particular academic year.

**Inspired-A youth group that will allow 12-16-year olds** to discover what it means to be a disciple of Jesus, and which will give parents the support they need to be able to respond to some of the bigger questions they may be asking. This group will replace the Confirmation programme, allowing young people to receive the Sacrament when they feel called to respond to the Lord by saying yes to this significant milestone in their faith journey.

We hope to launch the third group, **Faith Alive, for 9-12-year olds**, with their families, next year. This group will offer them an opportunity to learn about putting their faith into action, as well as well as enabling them to grow in friendship with other young Catholics. The sessions will involve fun and games for the children, as well as an opportunity to explore prayer.

If anyone is interested in helping out with any of these groups, do please get in touch as there is always room for anyone who has a passion for passing on our faith. Training and support will be provided by the Diocesan Youth Adviser.

If you would like to speak with members of the team please meet them in the narthex after mass on July, 2<sup>nd</sup>, before we all launch into our picnics.

Thank you again to all those involved in the process so far. We depend on your skill and generosity.

#### Catechesis Group 2023-2024 (RCIA - Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

In September we are starting a new **RCIA group** for those planning to be received into the Catholic Church. The aim of the group is to give an overview of Church teaching, some in-depth exploration of doctrine, and formation in the basic aspects of Christian living. The group will be led by Geoff Chapman, and will follow a course called *Sycamore*, a very helpful series of high-quality videos that give a good balance between input and group discussion. Each session is 60 to 90 minutes long, and the course will run weekly, during school term time, from September through to Easter. The group is informal and discussion based and is a great way to get to know people in the Parish better.

In previous years, we have also found that the course is very suitable for anyone who is exploring the Catholic faith, even if they are not sure about becoming Catholic, as well as Catholics who wish to grow in their understanding. This extra participation is also very helpful for those who are in RCIA, so we would encourage to come along to support them if you have the time.

Peru's lawmakers are about to vote on a new law that could cause a genocide in the Amazon. This hellish proposal has a target: the sacred lands of isolated Indigenous communities, **who are unaware**

#### **Gatwick Detainees Welfare Group**

GDWG is a small Crawley charity, helps people detained in two immigration removal centres at Gatwick Airport. Volunteers visit detained people, and the charity provides emotional and practical support. Refugee Tales is an outreach project of the charity that raises awareness of detention through walks and four published books. Since 2015, Refugee Tales walkers have walked in solidarity with refugees and detained people. They have been met with kindness and hospitality every step of the way.

Taking Chaucer's great poem of journeying as a model - established writers and people with lived experience of detention share their tales with local communities at evening events at the end of each day of walking. They enjoy live performances from renowned musicians. From Saturday 8th - Wednesday 12th July, Refugee Tales walker's journey from Three Bridges to Worthing.

There will be a FREE public evening event in Haywards Heath at 7pm on Saturday 8th July at the Hub **Theatre**, Haywards Heath College, Harlands Rd Haywards Heath RH16 1LT where writer Haifa Zangara will read a tale alongside a tale by a person who is an expert by experience and music by local Kora player Jali Mbye plus folk musician Greg Russell.

All money raised by the walk goes towards the charity, GDWG, so that support can continue for people in Gatwick Immigration Removal Centres and post-detention. This support includes weekly visits from Volunteer Visitors, phone credit to ensure detained people can contact their friends and family, clothes, referrals to lawyers and other organisations, and supermarket vouchers for people released into destitution. The funds also support the charity to continue inviting previously detained people on Refugee Tales walks and to keep working towards a future without detention.
