Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are all well. I send you all my prayers.

The Synod in Rome has just ended, and the participants have sent us a letter which they entitle *The Church must listen to everyone*. They tell how they were conscious of all of us who played our part in the preliminary stages: We lived this blessed time in profound communion with all of you. We were supported by your prayers, bearing with you your expectations, your questions, as well as your fears. As Pope Francis requested two years ago, a long process of listening and discernment was initiated, open to all the People of God, no one being excluded, to "journey together" under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, missionary disciples engaged in the following of Jesus Christ... We have listened intensely to the Word of God and the experience of others. Using the conversation in the Spirit method, we have humbly shared the wealth and poverty of our communities from every continent, seeking to discern what the Holy Spirit wants to say to the Church today. They emphasise the contributions of those of other Churches, and they tell how they have been especially aware of the wounds and scandalous inequalities which violence and poverty are creating in so many countries, and of those who have been forced to become migrants. We assured our solidarity and commitment alongside the women and men all over the world who are working to build justice and peace.

In the light of Jesus' cross and resurrection, they say: We entrusted to Him our common home where the cries of the earth and the poor are becoming increasingly urgent. They dwell on the Church's need of conversion, for the Church's vocation is to proclaim the Gospel not by focusing on itself, but by placing itself at the service of the infinite love with which God loved the world...To progress in its discernment, the Church absolutely needs to listen to everyone, starting with the poorest...It means listening to those who have been denied the right to speak in society or who feel excluded, even by the Church; listening to people who are victims of racism in all its forms—in particular in some regions to indigenous peoples whose cultures have been scorned. Above all, the Church of our time has the duty to listen, in a spirit of conversion, to those who have been victims of abuse committed by members of the ecclesial body, and to commit herself concretely and structurally to ensuring that this does not happen again. They also speak of listening to all laypeople, all called to holiness by virtue of their baptismal vocation — they mention catechists, children and young people, families, and all who wish to participate in discernment and decision-making structures.

Please see our website for the full text of this most encouraging document. Please help us in our parish to put these aspirations into practice, and please pray that we will form a community which can reflect something of the Kingdom of God.

Worth Pro Earth

On the 4th October, we celebrated the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of Pope Francis, from whom he draws inspiration for his work for ecology.

We remember in particular his encyclical, *Laudato Si, On the Care of Our Common Home*, which he wrote in 2015. To mark the close of the *Season of Creation* he gives us another document to encourage us to renew our work for the preservation of our planet, *Laudate Deum, Praise God.*

In this piece he renews his call to the whole world to heed the warning signs which we see around us which herald the collapse of our ecosystems. He writes: Eight years have passed since I published the Encyclical Letter Laudato Si', when I wanted to share with all of you, my brothers and sisters of our suffering planet, my heartfelt concerns about the care of our common home. Yet, with the passage of time, I have realized that our responses have not been adequate, while the world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing the breaking point". (LD #2)

Commentators for the Laudato Si Movement write: In his just over 20 pages, the Pope reviews the scientific data and the undeniable evidence of the climate crisis while appealing to "all people of good will" to act urgently because, there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, without a maturing of lifestyles and convictions within societies, and there are no cultural changes without personal changes.
