Dear Parishioners

Thirty First Sunday in OT (year A) 4th / 5th November 2023 No. 1358

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

This month of November is a traditional time to remember and pray for the faithful departed. The second of November is the day when we especially remember members of our families and our friends who have passed away. Some of you may have experienced the quite elaborate customs practised this day in traditionally Catholic countries. I remember how in Lima, Peru, we would visit the local cemetery where we would meet members of our parish gathered by the graves of their families, often having picnics and enjoying themselves, fully united with those whom they were remembering; and we priests would pray with them, and enjoy a sandwich. Looking back, I feel it was such a positive element of their culture, expressing a vibrant faith in our doctrine of the resurrection and eternal life which, we are promised, is the inheritance offered to each of us. Here, in Anglo Saxon and post Christian Britain, our celebrations of our faith are often rather less colourful; but I hope that many of you will have been able to join us for our mass on Thursday, when we will have prayed for your departed loved ones whose names you have given us on cards, and which will remain by the altar during this month of November. Please use the prayer which you will find below.

Meanwhile, the **Synod** in Rome finished last week, after several weeks of intense listening by men and women from all over the world. A Synthesis Report has been published. You can find it online. It is entitled A Synodal Church In Mission https://www.synod.va/en/news/a-synodal-church-in-mission.html Michael Woodward has kindly produced a synopsis of this full report which you may like to request from Maria in the parish office. The synopsis is headed: A Church that involves everyone and is close to the world's wounds. Looking ahead to the final session of the Synod next year, he explains: the text offers reflections and proposals on topics such as the role of women and the laity, the ministry of bishops, priesthood and the diaconate, the importance of the poor and migrants, digital mission, ecumenism, and abuse. The report explains the concept and practice of Synodality thus: "Synodal" and "synodality" are terms that "speak of a mode of being Church that integrates communion, mission, and participation". So, they indicate a way of living the Church, valuing differences and developing the active involvement of all.

Valuing differences and developing the active involvement of all are ideals which will strengthen every community, and I hope that together we can promote them in our parish. I will return to the content of the Report during the course of the next twelve months. Meanwhile, please do pray for the development of a strong parish community under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit.

Worth Pro Earth

On the 4th October, we celebrated the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of Pope Francis, from whom he draws inspiration for his work for ecology.

We remember in particular his encyclical, *Laudato Si, On the Care of Our Common Home*, which he wrote in 2015. To mark the close of the *Season of Creation* he gives us another document to encourage us to renew our work for the preservation of our planet, *Laudate Deum, Praise God.*

In this piece he renews his call to the whole world to heed the warning signs which we see around us which herald the collapse of our ecosystems. He writes: Eight years have passed since I published the Encyclical Letter Laudato Si', when I wanted to share with all of you, my brothers and sisters of our suffering planet, my heartfelt concerns about the care of our common home. Yet, with the passage of time, I have realized that our responses have not been adequate, while the world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing the breaking point". (LD #2)

Commentators for the Laudato Si Movement write: In his just over 20 pages, the Pope reviews the scientific data and the undeniable evidence of the climate crisis while appealing to "all people of good will" to act urgently because, there are no lasting changes without cultural changes, without a maturing of lifestyles and convictions within societies, and there are no cultural changes without personal changes.
