# **Dear Parishioners**

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

This Sunday is **World Day of The Poor**. This was an initiative of Pope Francis seven years ago, and has been a constant theme of his papacy. In his first major document, of 2013, The Joy of The Gospel, he writes: God's heart has a special place for the poor, so much so that he himself "became poor" (2 Cor 8:9). The entire history of our redemption is marked by the presence of the poor...For the Church, the option for the poor is primarily a theological category... God shows the poor "his first mercy". This divine preference has consequences for the faith life of all Christians...Inspired by this, the Church has made an option for the poor which is understood as a "special form of primacy in the exercise of Christian charity, to which the whole tradition of the Church bears witness" ... This is why I want a Church which is poor and for the poor. They have much to teach us. Not only do they share in the sensus fidei (the community of faith), but in their difficulties they know the suffering Christ. We need to let ourselves be evangelized by them. Writing two years later in Laudato Si, his encyclical about ecological issues, in the section headed Global Inequality, he writes: The gravest effects of all attacks on the environment are suffered by the poorest... we have to realize that a true ecological approach always becomes a social approach; it must integrate questions of justice in debates on the environment, so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. In his message to us for today he writes of the increasing urgency for change: We are living in times that are not particularly sensitive to the needs of the poor. The pressure to adopt an affluent lifestyle increases, while the voices of those dwelling in poverty tend to go unheard...The poor become a film clip that can affect us for a moment, yet when we encounter them in flesh and blood on our streets, we are annoyed and look the other way. He writes about those who do try to serve the poor: They are not superheroes but "next door neighbours", ordinary people who quietly make themselves poor among the poor. They do more than give alms: they listen, they engage, they try to understand and deal with difficult situations and their causes.

Do please consider if you can engage with the poor in a concrete way. Supporting the food banks by your contributions is always of great value, or the gift of clothing to the Gatwick Detainees, both of which can be left at the parish office. At a more personal level you might consider hosting a refugee from Ukraine, as suggested last week, or volunteering for the SVP in Crawley, or for Refugees Welcome or the Gatwick Detainees Welfare Group. The 28th Conference of the Parties (COP) climate change will take place in Dubai between 30th November and 12th December this year. As Pope Francis explained in his recent apostolic exhortation Laudate Deum, "the world in which we live is collapsing and may be nearing breaking point". Global temperatures continue to rise, and instances of extreme weather are becoming more frequent and more destructive. Those who are most affected by climate change, and upon whom the impact is greatest, are poor, marginalised communities in the Global South. As the Holy Father made clear, we are not acting quickly enough, nor strongly enough, when it comes to addressing climate change.

Inspired by the need to respond to such issues, Jesuit Missions is running a campaign, in collaboration with Jesuit European Social Centre and the Jesuit Centre for Faith & Justice throughout COP28, to access daily prayers, updates from COP28, regular blog posts, specialist tools for schools and parishes, and a dedicated podcast series.
