First Sunday of Advent (year B) 2nd / 3rd December 2023 No. 1362

Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

This Sunday we begin our celebration of the season of Advent. The word "Advent" means "Coming" – i.e. the Return of Jesus at the end of time. It has been the belief of Christians from earliest times that Jesus will return to establish God's Kingdom in its fullness and subject all things to God's authority, and was expressed especially by St Paul, to encourage his Gentile converts to remain steadfast in hope. Writing to the Corinthians about the resurrection he says: As all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ. But each in his own order: Christ the first fruits, then at his coming those who belong to Christ. Then comes the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, after he has destroyed every ruler and every authority and power. For he must reign until he has put all his enemies under his feet. (1Co 15.22-25) Paul believed that this would happen very soon, certainly in his own life time. Soon however it became clear that the time of waiting would after all be a long one, from a human perspective; but the hope which this belief enshrines is still ours today. As Paul's reading says this weekend: He will keep you steady until the last day, the day of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Perhaps today more than ever we need this strong hope of the fulfilment of God's good purpose for our world, His Creation. The anticipation of the possible collapse of the earth's climate and the news of violent conflict in so many countries might easily make us doubt God's control over the events of our world, and we urgently need to renew our sense of hope in God's action on our behalf. We can do this most especially through the celebration of our Eucharist when we thank God for all He has done and continues to do for us through Jesus, and as we look forward to his second coming. (EP 3)

At our Eucharist this Sunday we have a special celebration when we present Rachel Davies with the Bene Merenti medal. This is an award given by Pope Francis in recognition of the special service which members of the Church give to the community. Rachel has just completed twenty-five years as the First Communion Catechist for our parish, and twenty years as our safeguarding representative and as the coordinator of Junior Church, which she continues to serve. Her fidelity and commitment is itself a huge sign of hope for our community and an inspiration for us all to emulate, most especially in a culture in which perseverance and commitment are not often evident. Countless generations of children and families owe her a huge debt of gratitude for her generosity. Thank you Rachel!

Meanwhile, please continue to keep the COP28 in your prayers. We live in a moment of unprecedented crisis over our climate. Please see the WPE page below, and please come to the talk by John Paul de Quay, *Light in Our Darkness*, in Compass House after Sunday mass, when he will speak about some of the issues involved and offer us suggestions about how we can help.







We'll be marching to call for action at the COP28 climate talks, which will be taking place at the end of a year that has seen communities worldwide facing the effects of the climate crisis. Forest fires in the Mediterranean and floods in Libya have forced countless people from their homes, while drought in East Africa has left millions struggling to access food.

Jenny Finlayson from CAFOD writes: "I write to you today as we watch with hope and apprehension the unfolding crisis in the Holy Land.

Let me first of all reassure you that, though heavily restricted, humanitarian aid is-reaching people worst hit in Gaza through CAFOD's partners who live and work in the region. Thank you, so much, to all those of you have donated or fundraised so far to resource this aid.

However, with great sadness I must report to you more deaths of staff and volunteers in our partner organisations. Please do pray for their families and colleagues as you pray for the conflict to end. Their colleagues continue to risk their lives daily, to provide life-saving help to others in great need. As the conflict enters its ninth week, we are now also asking all parishes to do what they can to support our Israeli-Palestinian Crisis Appeal.

We also invite your parish to join us in <u>calling for a lasting peace</u> by writing to the Foreign Secretary. Thank you to the over 6,500 supporters and volunteers who already have."

We join with the Bishops Conference in praying that: 'as we approach the Holy Season of Advent...Christ the Prince of Peace will guide all devastated by this conflict into the ways of truth, reconciliation, and respectful coexistence.'

Stop the 14-day limit on experimenting on embryos being removed

The Human Fertilisation and Embryology Authority (HFEA) is pushing to remove the 14-day limit for experimenting on embryos, despite 97% of submissions from the general public to their consultation objecting to these plans.
