Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

This Sunday we celebrate **Peace Sunday**. Pope Francis has written us a message for this day, which is entitled *Artificial Intelligence and Peace*. It is clearly a complex theme, and his message encourages us to be aware of both the blessings and also the dangers of Artificial Intelligence (A.I.).

Pope Francis writes: We rightly rejoice and give thanks for the impressive achievements of science and technology, as a result of which countless ills that formerly plagued human life and caused great suffering have been remedied. At the same time, techno-scientific advances, by making it possible to exercise hitherto unprecedented control over reality, are placing in human hands a vast array of options, including some that may pose a risk to our survival and endanger our common home.

The remarkable advances in new information technologies, particularly in the digital sphere, thus offer exciting opportunities and grave risks, with serious implications for the pursuit of justice and harmony among peoples. Any number of urgent questions need to be asked. What will be the consequences, in the medium and long term, of these new digital technologies? And what impact will they have on individual lives and on societies, on international stability and peace?

In a section titled *The future of artificial intelligence: between promise and risk*, he writes: We need to remember that scientific research and technological innovations are not disembodied and "neutral", but subject to cultural influences. As fully human activities, the directions they take reflect choices conditioned by personal, social and cultural values in any given age. The same must be said of the results they produce: precisely as the fruit of specifically human ways of approaching the world around us, the latter always have an ethical dimension, closely linked to decisions made by those who design their experimentation and direct their production towards particular objectives. He adds that AI can only imitate certain aspects of human intelligence, and therefore is fragmentary.

He continues: The inherent dignity of each human being and the fraternity that binds us together as members of the one human family must undergird the development of new technologies. In particular he warns against the unregulated use of AI for waging war: The ability to conduct military operations through remote control systems has led to a lessened perception of the devastation caused by those weapon systems and the burden of responsibility for their use, resulting in an even more cold and detached approach to the immense tragedy of war.

Pope Francis ends with a call to prayer: It is my prayer at the start of the New Year that the rapid development of forms of artificial intelligence will not increase cases of inequality and injustice all too present in today's world, but will help put an end to wars and conflicts, and alleviate many forms of suffering that afflict our human family.

Worth Pro Earth

Jenny Edwards, member of Worth Pro Earth and a local councillor for the Green Party, writes:

As we enter the new year there are two news items in particular which Worth Pro Earth - together we suspect with many of you - will have been discussing.

As is - sadly - the norm, consensus on COP 28 is that it did not go far enough. The fact that there were more attendees representing the fossil fuel industries than there were from the 10 most climate vulnerable countries combined gave rise to dismay and cynicism. But we must remember that, incredibly, for the first time and after much debate, the parties at the Conference have come together to commit to the phasing out of fossil fuels. So, we are on the right path - at last.

However, the report on Tuesday that 2023 was the warmest year on record and that the scale of the temperature rise had taken even climate scientists by surprise was sobering. This has underlined how vital it is for all of us to hold those in power to account, and also to act as individuals in any way we can to reduce our emissions.

The Worth Pro Earth group meets monthly to consider and find ways to act on both these fronts. Taking our cue this month from 'Live Laudato Si' we are particularly drawn after the celebrations of Christmas to looking again at 'Live Simply '- one of the ways parishes are encouraged to follow the principles in Laudato Si. We will be looking at this again with some practical suggestions leading up to Lent.

Worth Pro Earth is a small group of parishioners with a particular interest in climate and ecology. We are diverse in our interest and experience and would love to hear from you if you would like to contribute in any way at all.
