First Sunday of Lent (year B) 17th / 18th February 2024 No. 1371

Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

As I write on Ash Wednesday we begin our observance of Lent. Ashes are a traditional Biblical symbol of repentance, or *metanoia*, as the Bible calls it – a fundamental change of heart. If I am honest I must confess that inside me there is something which does not want God and His love, a part of me which would rather be left alone, which wants to reject His constant invitation to be loved, to grow in generosity, to respond to His call. But, deep down, of course, I know that this is the only way to live which will bring me happiness and joy, since these come only from Him. Perhaps this is at the heart of our season of Lent – wanting to want to be with God, in Jesus; and all that we do for Lent, our extra practices of prayer and penance, generous care for others, and whatever we may choose to give up, needs to be directed to this one aim – what the Bible would call acquiring a pure heart, a heart which is set on God and His will alone. In most western European languages, the word for Lent means forty, remembering the forty days which Jesus spent in the desert after his baptism, wrestling with the meaning of his vocation to be God's Beloved Son, and preparing for his ministry to announce God's Kingdom. The English word Lent, however, refers to the lengthening of the days, suggesting the theme of growth and joy – our delight in our anticipation of spring, seeing the snow drops and daffodils bravely emerging from the ground - and our own growth in the Holy Spirit, the life and love of God our Father.

The origin of Lent was a time of prayer and special preparation for those preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil, in which the whole community joined, in support of their converts. So please continue to pray for our own RCIA group as they prepare for their reception at Easter.

Please pray too for those who will be baptised during our Sunday mass — Tobias, Luke, Tobias and Alexander, and their parents Stephen and Lindsay, Nick and Ghazal, and Emily. Our baptism is perhaps the most important moment in our lives, when we receive the Holy Spirit, and, through continuous conversion, begin to live with God's own life, a process which lasts until, and beyond, our death. All of this takes place within the community of Christian disciples, the Pilgrim People of God, the Church. During the ceremony we are all invited to renew our own baptismal vows, together with the children's parents. This is a good start to our preparation for the celebration of Easter. Please do make the families welcome on Sunday.

Worth Pro Earth - A Call to Action

The Laudato Si Movement offers a series of meditatins for Lent on ecological themes: February 14, Ash Wednesday, marks the beginning of Lent and our special campaign for people living in Europe, on the theme Stop and Listen

Stop and listen, because we are called to do so during the desert time of Lent. This theme can remind us of Angelus's devotion and the Sabbath's biblical tradition. It is above all a way to start or deepen our ecological conversion: to stop and listen to see the reality of the situation and reflect on what matters. As Pope Francis tells us: "It is time to act, and in Lent, to act also means to pause."

Every weekday, a small reflection or image will be offered to "stop and listen" for a few minutes at a fixed time each day (we suggest you set an alarm at noon or join the WhatsApp group).

Each week, the reflections will focus on a different theme to explore some dimensions of the ecological challenges we face in Europe.

Every Sunday, the <u>PDF Calendar</u> will propose a meditation on the Gospel and some intentions to pray for during mass.
