#### **Dear Parishioners**

I hope that you and your families are all well. I send you all my prayers.

As I write our parish secretary is away with her family in Scotland, following the death of her mother, Maida. Please pray for her and all her family. Meanwhile I am most grateful to Caroline Howells who is helping me to put together this edition of In Touch. Please excuse any imperfections in our work!

Many of you took part in the **Synodal process** which began in 2021. I hope that you found that to be a worthwhile experience. Your ideas and comments were then sent to the Diocese, which produced its own Synthesis. This in turn was incorporated in the National Synthesis which has been sent to Rome, where the final part of the process will take place in October of this year.

The organisers write: A four-year 'synodal' process is taking place across the Catholic Church. This is an important moment in the life of the world Church, with Pope Francis calling us all to reflect on the theme 'For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission.' The Pope is inviting us to take this journey together. As the Preparatory Document for the Synod expresses, "This path of walking together is the most effective way of manifesting and putting into practice the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God".

A new document was then prepared which was released last year, Instrumentum Laboris, which the bishops will take as their starting point in October. This document proposes for their discussion topics such as the role of women and the laity, the ministry of bishops, priesthood and the diaconate, the importance of the poor and migrants, digital mission, ecumenism, and abuse. Please see the Synthesis <u>synthesis report</u>.

We are invited to comment on this document. Do please look at it and send any comments to Deacon Jon Harman - *here*. As with pilgrimage, the journey together is more important than the arrival, so now the process of dialogue is more important than the final document.

#### **Worth Pro Earth - A Call to Action**

The Laudato Si Movement offers a series of meditatins for Lent on ecological themes : February 14, Ash Wednesday, marked the beginning of Lent and our special campaign for people living in Europe, on the theme Stop and Listen

Stop and listen, because we are called to do so during the desert time of Lent. This theme can remind us of Angelus's devotion and the Sabbath's biblical tradition. It is above all a way to start or deepen our ecological conversion: to stop and listen to see the reality of the situation and reflect on what matters. As Pope Francis tells us: "It is time to act, and in Lent, to act also means to pause."

Every weekday, a small reflection or image will be offered to "stop and listen" for a few minutes at a fixed time each day (we suggest you set an alarm at noon or join the WhatsApp group).

Each week, the reflections will focus on a different theme to explore some dimensions of the ecological challenges we face in Europe.

Every Sunday, the PDF Calendar will propose a meditation on the Gospel and some intentions to pray for during mass.

#### Extra recycling collections from your home

Did you know that all districts and borough councils in West Sussex offer free kerbside collections of small electrical items? You shouldn't dispose of small electricals in either your recycling or waste bins at home. This is because they often contain hazardous materials which can start a fire when the items are crushed during the collection and sorting process. District and boroughs councils also offer a variety of other free kerbside collections including textiles, batteries, and coffee pods. The collections they offer, as well as how they work differ, so it is important to check with your local council for more information.

#### **Switch & Ditch and Give Dry a Try**

<u>Give Dry a Try</u> and embrace concentrated alternatives to everyday household products. We're encouraging you to Switch to eco-friendly, and Ditch the water-laden, plastic-wrapped and chemically laden formulations which plague our homes and ecosystems. At the Sussex Green Hub, on the last Saturday of each month, our mini <u>Zero Waste Shop</u>volunteers will help you try and buy a whole host of dry alternatives to get you inspired on your sustainability journey including: <u>Faith in Nature</u> shampoo and conditioner bars, <u>Overherd</u> powdered oat milk, <u>Friendly</u> kitchen bars and <u>Ocean Saver</u> laundry sheets (we only have the laundry sheets as samples at the moment)

Want more ideas on how to say goodbye to liquids and hello to dry alternatives? visit our website.

At the Sussex Green Hub you can purchase Overherd oat milk powder: 400g bag £7.80 (equal to 4 Tetrapaks) or 800g bag £12.80 (equal to 8 Tetrapaks) or you can purchase a one off or subscribe for a regular order with this link. What's even better is that if you purchase from their site using this link each purchase will result in a donation of £5 to Sussex Green Living!

#### **Abortion Decriminalisation Threat**

Abortion campaigners are trying to hijack the Government's Criminal Justice Bill with abortion amendments. It's important that MPs hear from constituents like you. <u>Care for what you believe in</u> There are also postcards available in the narthex for those who prefer.

Pope Francis wants the Jubilee Year in 2025 to have a particular focus on prayer, with the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales (CBCEW) offering a five-week course designed to help us deepen our understanding of the Lord's Prayer called *We Dare To Say*. Speaking about the Lord's Prayer, Fr Jan Nowotnik, Director of Mission CBCEW said:

"There is a line in the Our Father that is a prayer of petition, 'Give us this day our daily bread'. When I pray that line, I'm saying, 'Give me today, Lord, just what I need – just for this day'. In the midst of some of the trials and tribulations of life, but also the joys, it's about realising that I put my hope in the Lord who gives me everything that I need – the Lord whose kingdom is in heaven.

"Give us this day our daily bread'. Why? So that we can joyfully trust and hope in Him, but also so that we can forgive each other, so that we can put right some of those wrongs. Which takes us back to the major theme of a Jubilee year taken from the book of Leviticus – allowing the land to grow fallow, allowing that time of tranquilly and peace, so that we can rid each other of the debts that often occur when we don't forgive each other, when we're not kind and supportive to each other. To do that, you have to hope in the promises of the Lord – 'Give us this day our daily bread'."
