
- 1. From ashes to the living font your Church must journey, Lord; baptised in grace, in grace renewed by your most holy word.

- 3. Our graves split open, bring us back, your promise to proclaim: to darkened tombs call out 'Arise!' and glorify your name.




First Reading: Jeremiah 31:31-34
