# **Dear Parishioners**

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

Last week I wrote about the concept of *Imaginative Vision*, which Mgr James Shea defined as something which forms the basis of action for societies and individuals...It is not so much something that is seen as something through which everything else is seen. It appears, if at all, as simply self-evident. This vision has changed radically in recent years, moving from a Christian world view to a non-Christian one. He explains: The Christian way of seeing the world has been replaced by a new one. The new assumed priorities and values of our society reject the spiritual, reject anything we cannot see, or touch, or hear, or taste or smell. The Christian vision of the world sees a combination of the spiritual and the physical; the new assumptions reject the spiritual and so they are, by definition materialist. Only the physical matters. Such a view of the world radically changes how people behave. If we are to exercise Jesus' commission to "make disciples of all nations", then we must be aware of the culture which surrounds us and take steps to strengthen our own Christian vision, and take account of the prevailing culture of society. The author continues: So, what is the programme for action? First of all, it is to understand where we are, the world we live in, and the people around us. We need to rediscover for ourselves the Great Story of God's action in the world. This is a story that stretches way back into the past, but it reaches to this very day: each of us is an actor in the drama of God's love for his people. This weekend we begin our celebration of Holy Week, when, as disciples of Jesus, we remember through our liturgy the events of Jesus' final days in his earthly ministry, his Passion and death and his resurrection. When we celebrate the liturgy, these events are made present to us again: this is not a simple psychological remembering, but one which involves our whole being and, by God's grace, it changes our lives. Through the celebration we become in a deeper way members of the People of God on the way to salvation. I commend to you all the liturgies which we offer at Worth, especially the Easter Vigil, which is known as "the night of nights", the climax of the Church's year, as we are drawn into the death and resurrection of Jesus. I also commend the practice of lectio divina, the prayerful reading of the scriptural texts which we will hear during these liturgies. Ask God to speak to you as you meditate on the words. (The image often used is *rumination*, just as a cow chews the cud!) Be confident that God has a message which is specially for you. Be open to God's promptings.

#### Worth Pro Earth - A Call to Action

The Laudato Si Movement offers a series of meditatins for Lent on ecological themes: February 14th, Ash Wednesday, marked the beginning of Lent and our special campaign for people living in Europe, on the theme Stop and Listen.

Stop and listen, because we are called to do so during the desert time of Lent. This theme can remind us of the Angelus devotion and the Sabbath biblical tradition. It is above all a way to start or deepen our ecological conversion: to stop and listen to see the reality of the situation and reflect on what matters. As Pope Francis tells us: "It is time to act, and in Lent, to act also means to pause."

Every weekday, a small reflection or image will be offered to "stop and listen" for a few minutes at a fixed time each day (we suggest you set an alarm at noon or join the WhatsApp group). Each week, the reflections will focus on a different theme to explore some dimensions of the ecological challenges we face in Europe. Every Sunday, the PDF Calendar will propose a meditation on the Gospel and some intentions to pray for during mass.

## Extra recycling collections from your home

Did you know that all districts and borough councils in West Sussex offer free kerbside collections of small electrical items? You shouldn't dispose of small electricals in either your recycling or waste bins at home. This is because they often contain hazardous materials which can start a fire when the items are crushed during the collection and sorting process. District and boroughs councils also offer a variety of other free kerbside collections including textiles, batteries, and coffee pods. The collections they offer, as well as how they work differ, so it is important to check with your local council for more information.

#### **Think Before you Throw!**

Did you know that 59% of what's in the average waste bin doesn't need to be there! That's why we're launching the next phase of our Think Before You Throw campaign focusing on reducing this number as much as possible. West Sussex Council have produced videos on how to reduce your food waste and how to recycle additional materials at the kerbside and Recycling Centres. For example, did you know that the average family of four could save £80 a month by reducing their food waste? And that shredded paper can be recycled (inside an old cardboard box) at our Recycling Centres as it is processed differently from the paper collected from your recycling bin at home. At the Sussex Green Hub, on the last Saturday of each month, our mini Zero Waste Shop volunteers will help you try and buy a whole host of dry alternatives to get you inspired on your sustainability journey including: Faith in Nature shampoo and conditioner bars, Overherd powdered oat milk, Friendly kitchen bars and Ocean Saver laundry sheets (we only have the laundry sheets as samples at the moment)

At the Sussex Green Hub you can purchase Overherd oat milk powder: 400g bag £7.80 (equal to 4 Tetrapaks) or 800g bag £12.80 (equal to 8 Tetrapaks) or you can purchase a one off or subscribe for a regular order with this link. What's even better is that if you purchase from their site using this link each purchase will result in a donation of £5 to Sussex Green Living!

# Pope Francis wants the Jubilee Year in 2025 to have a particular focus on prayer.

With the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales (CBCEW) offering a five-week course designed to help us deepen our understanding of the Lord's Prayer called <u>We Dare to Say</u>

Speaking about the Lord's Prayer, Fr Jan Nowotnik, Director of Mission CBCEW said:

"There is a line in the Our Father that is a prayer of petition, 'Give us this day our daily bread.' When I pray that line, I'm saying, 'Give me today, Lord, just what I need – just for this day.' In the midst of some of the trials and tribulations of life, but also the joys, it's about realising that I put my hope in the Lord who gives me everything that I need – the Lord whose kingdom is in heaven.

"Give us this day our daily bread.' Why? So that we can joyfully trust and hope in Him, but also so that we can forgive each other, so that we can put right some of those wrongs. Which takes us back to the major theme of a Jubilee year taken from the book of Leviticus – allowing the land to grow fallow, allowing that time of tranquilly and peace, so that we can rid each other of the debts that often occur when we don't forgive each other, when we're not kind and supportive to each other. To do that, you have to hope in the promises of the Lord – 'Give us this day our daily bread'."
