
Processional Hymn




First Reading: Acts 1:15-17, 20-26


Abbey Choir: Non nobis Domine: att. William Byrd (1543-1623) "Not to us, Lord not to us, but to your name give the glory. Ps 115



Father, I pray that they may be one as we also are one, alleluia.


