Dear Parishioners

I hope that you and your families are well. I send you all my prayers.

This weekend we mark **World Communications Day**. We are invited to contribute to a collection to support the work of the Catholic Communications Network, which provides facilities and training for those working in the apostolate of the mass media. Today we hear much about the dangers of artificial intelligence and fake news. Pope Francis, in his message for this day, quotes from Guardini: "We are constantly in the process of becoming. We must enter into this process, each in his or her own way, with openness but also with sensitivity to everything that is destructive and inhumane therein". Pope Francis continues: At this time in history, which risks becoming rich in technology and poor in humanity, our reflections must begin with the human heart. Only by adopting a spiritual way of viewing reality, only by recovering a wisdom of the heart, can we confront and interpret the newness of our time and rediscover the path to a fully human communication. In the Bible, the heart is seen as the inward place of our encounter with God. No doubt, machines possess a limitlessly greater capacity than human beings for storing and correlating data, but human beings alone are capable of making sense of that data.

Meanwhile, CAFOD ask us to take part in their campaign to reduce or abolish the debts of the most highly indebted countries. They write: Many of the world's poorest countries have been plunged into a new debt crisis. Despite facing significant poverty burdens, countries are having to make huge repayments on high-interest loans to wealthy banks, institutions and governments, leaving them unable to properly fund essential services. This debt burden also leaves countries less able to cope with the increasing effects of climate change. In many countries, debts are being paid at the expense of hiring doctors and teachers, building schools, hospitals and sewage systems, preparing for floods or coping with droughts. The Bible teaches us that money lending is about accompanying vulnerable people, not about profiteering. But in our current global system, powerful banks make huge profits from the vulnerability of poorer nations. Pope Francis has declared 2025 a 'Jubilee year', which in the Church is historically a time for cancelling debt and restoring equality. As we prepare for the Jubilee year, and approach a general election, we're calling on political parties to address this by passing a 'Debt Justice Law' if they form the next government.

Earth Day 2024

This year the 2024 Earth Day theme was Planet vs Plastics, which highlighted the critical need to cope with the ever-growing plastic pollution problem. The theme's proposed goal is to reduce global plastic production by 60% by 2040, which calls for individual action to combat this crisis. The Big Plastic Count

The Big Plastic Count took place just over a month ago in which 225,000 participants took part. The UK is still producing far too much plastic. As part of the UK Plastics Pact supermarkets promised to make all their plastic packaging reusable, recyclable or compostable by 2025. If you counted all the pieces of plastic that the UK uses in one week, one second at a time, it would take you 53 years and 7 months.

The UK tops the charts for plastic waste per person globally, this is second only to the US.

Governments have now started UN negotiations for a Global Plastics Treaty, we need to keep the pressure up to make sure the treaty is as strong as it can be.



Call for UK to stop arming Israel.

Israel has begun to attack Rafah in the southern part of Gaza, one of the most densely populated areas on Earth. Hundreds of thousands could be killed – yet the UK government is still allowing arms to be exported to Israel.

This must stop. The UK has a responsibility to prevent civilians being killed and injured. Allowing the export of weaponry and military technology is contributing to the suffering.

We need you to <u>urge your MP to push for an end to arms sales</u> as a crucial step to stopping the suffering in Gaza.

News from our Diocese and from our Bishops

Bishop Richard issued his third Pastoral Plan for the Diocese "The Word Who is Life: The Call to Mission" in January. As part of the plan, church communities currently forming deaneries will become a moderated parish "community of communities". They write: "It is in the interests of us all – and all those people who so badly need to hear the good news, and all the generations of future disciples yet to be born – that we make real the vision our Bishop has set before us: the vision of our parishes as 'communities of saints [and] schools of discipleship'... The world needs the good news; we are the frail earthen vessels to whom he has chosen to entrust it to at this particular moment. We are the ones who have been sent." Please pray for the success of the Bishop's vision for our Diocese. It is not yet clear how our own parish will be affected by the changes, but we will keep you informed as it becomes clearer.

News from the Bishops of England and Wales

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales (CBCEW) have issued a pastoral reflection on gender. The document, called *Intricately Woven by the Lord*, emphasises that all are welcome in the Church, but says that the sexual identity of an individual is not a purely "cultural or social construction." We are all created in the image of God, with a dignity given to us by our creator. The bishops stress that leading people to the fullness of life in Christ is a journey rooted in truth as well as compassion. They write: *Accompaniment is crucial to the journey of faith, and we wish to emphasise that everyone is welcome in the Church. It is vital that as followers of Christ we imitate the boundless mercy and compassion of God as we deal with the complexity of another's life. But this needs to be done with a clear understanding of the Catholic vision and understanding of the human person and a holistic view of human sexuality." The Rwanda Bill

Bishop Paul McAleenan, Lead Bishop for Migrants and Refugees for the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales (CBCEW), joined the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, and leaders from a number of Christian churches, to highlight their shared commitment to caring for the most vulnerable while paying tribute to all those who "live out Jesus' call to feed and clothe the poor, and to welcome the stranger, at times in the face of opposition and prejudice." In a separate statement issued by the CBCEW, Bishop Paul said: "The passing of the Rwanda Bill [on Tuesday night] fails to address the urgent need to ensure that there are more safe and legal routes by which asylum seekers and refugees can reach the UK. I once again call on our government for a more compassionate approach to migration; one that seeks to protect vulnerable lives and support those fleeing persecution and hardship."
