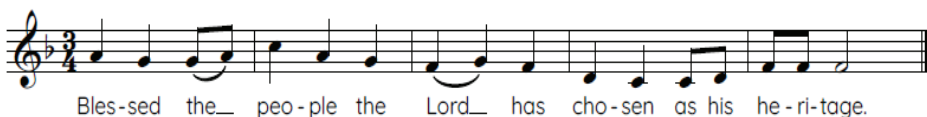
First Reading: Wisdom 18: 6-9
